Daydawn Advocacy Centre is an initiative of the Catholic Church on behalf of indigenous people, especially Noongar people of the South West, whose rights and legitimate aspirations are often difficult to attain. It is an act of solidarity for those who suffer disadvantage or rejection. It is an affirmation of the God-given dignity of every person. It is a call for reconciliation, mutual forgiveness and unity as one family under God.

The Daydawn Advocacy Centre promotes the rights of the individual and the full participation of the indigenous population in society.

As a Catholic organisation the Centre also promotes the full inclusion of Aboriginal people in the life, worship, education and spirit-filled community of the Church at every level. In this it works closely with the Catholic Aboriginal Ministry.

Daydawn Advocacy Centre seeks to respond faithfully to the challenges made by Pope John Paul II in his address to Aboriginal people in Alice Springs in November 1986. "The Church herself in Australia will not be fully the Church that Jesus Christ wants her to be until you have made your contribution to her life and until that contribution has been joyfully received by others."
